UPDATED HANDBOOK OF BYLAWS COMING 1 JULY 2007

The State Council and the Rules Sub-committee have been working on a revised Handbook of Bylaws to be effective 1 July 2007.

There will be a new Day Attendance Form released with the Handbook changes.

This Handbook is a far improved rules book from previous versions in the 1990's etc and is almost in a state where there will be minimal changes in the foreseeable future.

FOCUS ON CONSISTENCY

The State Council have agreed to work hard on getting State, Zones and Clubs rules and operations to be consistent across Victoria.

We want consistency for riders competing anywhere in Victoria and to have rule interpretations providing a level playing field. We also want club administration to reflect the rules and statutory requirements.

This will remove confusion and disagreements for riders and officials.

They will enforce this consistency policy and take action when any level of pony club knowingly goes outside the rules and potentially be left uninsured.

The State Council are having a workshop to identify key areas for improvement and develop strategies for implementation.

As per rule 8 for the State Championship Rules issued for this event, please ensure that your gear complies with PCAV Gear Rules for Flat Teams, Musical Rides (rule 17) and Fancy Dress (rule 18) –

17 Flat Teams and Musical Rides

Unless specifically mentioned here, the fit and condition of gear must be as described previously.

17.1 Bits	Snaffle bits only must be used, in accordance with rule 21.
17.2 Nosebands	Only Cavesson, Dropped, Grackle and Hanoverian nosebands may be used, in accordance with rule 22.2.
17.3 Cheek Guards	Not permitted.
17.4 Horse Leg Wear	Leg wear of any description is not permitted.
17.5 Martingale	Not permitted.
17.6 Spurs	Not permitted.
17.7 Whip	Permitted, not exceeding 750 mm, refer to rule 10.10.
17.8 Plaiting	Optional.

18 Fancy Dress

18.1 Helmets	Always required.
18.2 Boots	Always required.
18.3 Armband	Always required.
18.4 Horse Leg Wear	Leg wear of any description is not permitted.
18.5 Spurs	Not permitted.

This means uniform is not mandatory for fancy dress.

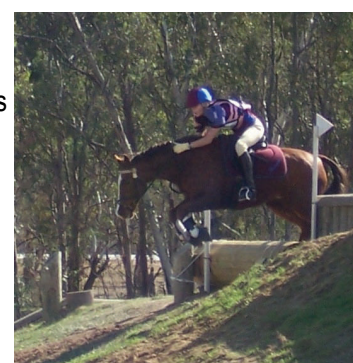

FEEDING DURING THE DROUGHT

With the country still in the grip of drought and winter fast approaching it is important to be aware of your horse's nutrition requirements and plan accordingly for their welfare.

The following article from the latest Horse Industry Council newsletter will help you understand what your horse requires.



Drought conditions continue to cause heartache for many horse owners. Years of below average rainfall mean that pastures are scarce and water levels remain low. Over the past few months there have been increasing reports of horses in severe under nutrition and in a very poor state of body condition. All animal welfare agencies have been massively overstretched as they try to cope with the unusually large numbers of animals (including horses) affected by the ongoing dry conditions.

In most of the country pastures are non-existent. This means that horses must be fed with hay and grains or other supplements. Stored feed is reducing by the day and has been at unheard of prices over the past few months making it difficult for many horse owners to be able to afford to keep their horses.

Many dams and streams are dry or at very low levels. This potentially makes such watering points hazardous for horses because they can become stuck in mud and difficult to extricate from their predicament. Horse owners can fence off these areas and provide alternative watering points in troughs or buckets.

The cooler days of autumn are here and winter is fast approaching. In colder weather animals have an increased energy requirement to keep themselves at normal body temperature. At the moment most horses have reduced insulating layers of body fat, making them even more susceptible to the colder temperatures over the next few months. While rugging horses might be an option, it is vital that rugs are removed twice weekly to inspect the horse's body condition. Rugs can keep horses warm, but unless they are removed regularly and the horse inspected, the owner can be oblivious to some underlying problem including a loss of body condition. Horses that have visibly lost body condition have probably been losing body weight (that is they are in a negative energy balance) for a number of weeks before this becomes noticeable to the eye. Where possible, horses should be weighed or have their body weight estimated at least monthly.

AHIC urges horse owners to take stock of their particular situation over the Easter break. Horse owners should carefully examine the current state of their horses, and determine if they have enough feed and water to carry them through until next spring - for the next six months or so. Adult horses need to consume 2% to 3% of their body weight daily and will drink about 2 to 3 litres of water for every kilogram of feed consumed (more if they are in work or in hot conditions). Horses in good condition now can probably maintain themselves on 2% of body weight fed daily, but horses that are in poor condition will need closer to 3% of their body weight daily. The quality of the available feed and water are also important in how much a horse will need to consume for maintenance. Horse owners can obtain more specific information on drought feeding of horses by using the available links at www.horsecouncil.org.au

It is important that horse owners take time now to evaluate carefully their particular situation so that their horses can be maintained through the next few months. Even with rain, there is unlikely to be much pasture growth before the weather warms up next September or October. Any pasture that grows in the next few weeks is likely to be eaten and not be allowed to develop into a useful amount of fodder. It would be a tragedy for horses to be carried on into the winter months if provisions have not been made well in advance for their feed and shelter.

If horse owners are unable to care for their horses, then they should consider moving their horses on to agistment or to another owner who can provide necessary feed and water.

OUTBREAK OF STRINGHALT

Due to the ongoing drought conditions horses are eating plants that they would otherwise avoid which has caused toxins to be ingested. As toxins build up in the body they can affect the nervous system causing symptoms such as stringhalt to develop.



There is a widespread outbreak of stringhalt and other nervous signs in horses in Victoria recently.

Horse owners should be on the lookout for horses that develop peculiar actions in the rear limbs, evidence of staggering, or any other unusual behavioural signs.

If horse owners see such signs in their horses, they should contact their local veterinary clinic, the local Department of Primary Industries office, or the Equine Centre at Werribee

POTENTIAL OUTBREAK OF STRANGLES

There have been reported cases of Strangles on the NSW / Vic border and pony clubs should be aware of the symptoms and treatment of strangles.

Strangles is a highly contagious bacterial or viral disease, mainly affecting horses under six years old.

Symptoms:

The symptoms are dullness, apathy and loss of appetite, soon followed by a rise in temperature. Nasal discharge, thin at first but becoming thick and yellow, mucous membrane of the eye turns bright red. Sore throat, and difficulty swallowing. The glands in the throat and jowl region swell up and become hot and tense, and after a few days one or more abscesses form under the lower jaw. Once these burst and drain, the temperature will fall and the horse will be well on the way to recovery, but if they fail to burst, infection may spread through the bloodstream.

Treatment:

Isolate the horse immediately you suspect strangles. Keep him warm and send for the vet urgently. Don't bring him into a stable before the vet arrives as most cases do better in the open air and there is less risk of complications. Fomenting the glands may give some relief pending the vet's arrival.

This is a very serious illness.

Please monitor your horses and contact your vet if symptoms occur.

The facilities were great 200 stables with bedding, heaps of powered sights for trucks & camping & plenty of hot showers & toilets throughout the grounds.

There was representation from NSW 120 riders, QLD 33 riders & Vic 5 riders.

Our Victorian riders did well with;

Eliza Baldwin taking out the overall championship {15au 17 yrs} on a score of 38 out of a possible 40pts. Placing 1st AM5, 2nd in the next AM5, 1st in Power & speed & 2nd in the Grand Prix.

Jessica Fisher-Curnow, {under 13yrs} Placed 7th in the power & speed, & 9th in the Grand Prix.

Edwina Hare, placing 8th in the AM5. Edwina had won the 13au 15yr Championship last year {2005}. The NSW riders were keen to win it back this year.

Kate Hare {under 13yrs}, & Emma Greaves {17 au 26yrs} Rode consistently all weekend, but unfortunately were unplaced.
